Rev. Dr. Charles F. Boyer

Founding Director

The Reverend Dr. Charles Franklin Boyer is a third-generation African Methodist Episcopal preacher. He is the pastor of Bethel A.M.E. Church in Woodbury, New Jersey, and the founder of Salvation and Social Justice, a non-partisan Black faith-rooted organization that believes liberation should precede legislation and prophetic vision should precede public policy.

Dr. Boyer is a leading faith voice in New Jersey for racial justice issues. His advocacy has led to the statewide adoption of racial impact analysis for sentencing, closure of youth prisons, voting rights restoration for people on probation and parole, the independent prosecutor law, and restricting solitary confinement. He works closely with the Black Legislative Caucus and is a coconvener of the United Black Agenda. He is New Jersey's leading religious figure in the campaign to abolish the drug war, isolated confinement, and the criminalization of Black people. Rev. Boyer has been recognized as one of New Jersey's 25 most influential African Americans by the South Jersey Journal, a Game Changer by the NAACP, a Torch Bearer by the ACLU, a Movement Maker by NJ Working Families, and a Community Servant by NJ Citizen Action. He has been recognized by the NJ Work Environment Council and received the Making Democracy Work award by the League of Women Voters. He was named #4 on the "Twenty-Five People to Watch in 2019" by NJ Advanced Media for his work around police accountability and is a 2020 Jefferson Award recipient.

He is married to Rosalee and they have three children; Shaina, Kyle, and Jayden. More than anything, Rev. Boyer is passionate about the spiritual disciplines especially prayer and meditation. He rises early every morning to commune with God and seek guidance. His favorite scripture is Psalms 27:13 I would have lost heart, unless I had believed, that I would see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.





BIOGRAPHY

The concept of Exodus began in 1994 with **Curtis Gardner**, the founding member, organizing a small singing group from members of the North Stelton AME Church's Inspirational Male Chorus. In 1995, the group settled into a trio of voices that became the foundation for Exodus. This group consisted of **Curtis Gardner**, **Marvin Stone**, and **Willie Walker**.

In 1996 **Anthony Shields** joined as lead singer and created a quartet. A year later, **Rex Hush** was asked to sit in for a performance and made such a big impression that he became a permanent fixture. In 1998 **Mike Griffith** was brought on to lend his "booming" bass voice to the ministry and the group decided to change its name to Exodus 4:12 coinciding with their first recording, "New Life".

This unique group of God-filled men continued to mold their sound and produced their first CD single "Father, Jesus, What's Going On" at the end of 1999.

In April of 2001, regrettably, original member, **Willie Walker**, left Exodus 4:12 due to his out-of-state relocation. **David Andrews** was asked to join and graciously accepted the responsibility to minister through song with the group. In 2002, Exodus 4:12 completed and released their first full album "God Said It".

Shortly thereafter, **Mike Griffith** also left the fold due to an overextended schedule and business commitments. Exodus continued on its journey and in 2007 released their second album, "Know What It's Like".

In 2011, founding member, **Curtis Gardner**, was unable to consistently perform due to relocation and health issues. Exodus 4:12 thanks God for the time **Willie**, **Mike and Curtis** spent with the group, and they will always remain a part of the ministry in spirit if not in person.

Exodus 4:12 now consists of **Dave Andrews**, **Rex Hush**, **Anthony Shields**, **and Marvin Stone**. They plan to continue so as the Lord leads them. For as it is written in the Old Testament "**Exodus 4:12**", God speaks to Moses and instructs him:

"Now therefore go, and I will be with thy mouth, and teach thee what thou shalt say"

ADDRESSING THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

Dear Bethany Family,

As the COVID-19 strain of the Coronavirus spreads, it is in our interest to keep you informed and protected. We encourage you to practice proper hygiene habits and be careful when interacting with others. Here are some precautions to take:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water, for at least 20 seconds, or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, or cough or sneeze into your elbow.
- If you are sick, stay home.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Instead of shaking hands, greet others with a fist bump, elbow bump, "Wakanda Forever," or anything that does not require direct physical contact.
- Do not use your fingertips to touch shared surfaces. For example, you may use paper towels to open doors, press elevator buttons, etc.
- Keep hand sanitizer and disinfectants within reach and in locations you frequently access, such as the entrance to your home, your car, and any personal bags that you carry.
- Stock up on medications and other essentials you may need in the event of quarantine, such as nonperishable food items.

We especially encourage our seniors to take extra precautions, as data has proven that they are most at risk of catching the Coronavirus.
