A graduate of Barnard College of Columbia University and Union Theological Seminary of New York City, she has committed herself to being a community and people connector and bridge. She has held various positions in both the non-profit and political spheres. At Bethel, Ardmore where she has served for close to five (5) years, she has been instrumental in helping to bridge the gap amongst various faith traditions and public/private sectors. Along with her congregation, launched the first community garden in South Ardmore, continues to provide a free after school program and this past summer worked alongside interfaith colleagues to launch a summer feeding pilot program for neighborhood children. In her free time, Carolyn enjoys discovering new restaurants, walking and traveling.





Guest Artist Charisse Mackey

She has traveled across the globe on Holland America Cruise lines with the BB King's All Star Band, garnering her the recognition as one of Holland America's Top Female Entertainers. Because of her show-stopping vocals and energy, she is now featured on the Holland America national commercial, which airs in all 50 states on multiple networks and online outlets. Additionally, you can also regularly catch Charisse performing with artists on the Soul Train, Country, and Smooth Jazz cruises.

Charisse's artistry is inescapable. Her voice has been described as smooth, calm, and strong. With precise versatility, she incorporates R&B, pop, funk, country, reggae, and hip hop into her music. No matter which genre of music you prefer; her vibe and melodic presence will resonate with you.

Charisse's collaborations and features with various audiences have garnered over 10 million views on social media sites and have sold ten of thousands of albums worldwide. Her collaborative expertise has helped to launch her into some of music's most well respected spaces.

How much should I give?



Giving is a PRACTICAL matter, too, because the offering

makes it possible for the church to pay its bills and carry out its mission in Christ's name.

The Bible says that we should set aside our "first fruits"- that our offering to God should be the first portion we set aside, not what remains.

Some people give by **PROPORTION**:

For example, \$2 or \$3 per week for every \$1000 of annual incon Others set aside a PERCENTAGE of their income.

ADDRESSING THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

Dear Bethany Family,

As the COVID-19 strain of the Coronavirus spreads, it is in our interest to keep you informed and protected. We encourage you to practice proper hygiene habits and be careful when interacting with others. Here are some precautions to take:

• Wash your hands often with soap and water, for at least 20 seconds, or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

• Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

• Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, or cough or sneeze into your elbow.

- If you are sick, stay home.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Instead of shaking hands, greet others with a fist bump, elbow bump, "Wakanda Forever," or anything that does not require direct physical contact.

• Do not use your fingertips to touch shared surfaces. For example, you may use paper towels to open doors, press elevator buttons, etc.

• Keep hand sanitizer and disinfectants within reach and in locations you frequently access, such as the entrance to your home, your car, and any personal bags that you carry.

• Stock up on medications and other essentials you may need in the event of quarantine, such as nonperishable food items.

We especially encourage our seniors to take extra precautions, as data has proven that they are most at risk of catching the Coronavirus.
